

REPORT OF TOWN MEETING

March 14, 1933

Meeting called to order at 9:20 A. M.

Warrant duly sworn to by the Moderator. Check list signed and sworn before the Town Clerk.

Warrant read by the Moderator. Polls opened for voting at 9:25.

Amendment made by Howard C. Page on Art. I that all officers be elected by plurality vote. This amendment voted.

Voted that the polls remain open until 6:45 P. M.

Proceeded to vote by Australian Ballot. Polls declared closed at 6:45 P. M.

Meeting called to order at 8 o'clock for the purpose of voting on the articles in the warrant.

ART. II. Voted that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$6022.40 to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

ART. III. Voted that the Clerk read the recommendations of the Finance Committee with each article.

Recommendation of Finance Committee relating to Art. III read that Articles III and VIII be considered together but that only one of them be raised by taxation.

Voted that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$1155.00 for State Aid Construction, the State to pay \$2310.00.

ART. IV. The Finance Committee recommended that this Article pass as written in the warrant.

Voted that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to put in a culvert and drainage near Christie's Poultry Farm, in order to give sanitary conditions and take care of surplus water in that vicinity.

ART. V. The Finance Committee recommended that this Article was inexpedient and ought not to pass.

Voted to indefinitely postpone this article.

ART. VI. The Finance Committee recommended that the sum of \$500.00 be raised on this Article.

Voted that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to tarvia, patch and repair the Newton Junction Road from the Newton line to Whittier's Corner, South Kingston.

ART. VII. The Finance Committee recommended that this Article pass as written.

Voted that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for hose and other equipment for the Fire Dept.

ART. VIII. The Finance Committee recommended that this Article was covered by Art. III.

Voted that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$1500.00, the State to pay \$4500.00 for the permanent improvement of the main highway known as the Derry Road, leading from the recent construction to the Danville line, said amount to be proportioned three to one.

ART. IX. The Finance Committee recommended that the sum of \$400.00 be raised on the Little River Road, so called.

Voted that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for repairs on the Little River Road, so called.

ART. X. Finance Committee recommended that inasmuch as it is anticipated that in the future Scotland St. would be a State Road, the sum of \$200 be spent.

Voted that the sum of \$200.00 be raised and appropriated for repairs on Scotland Road.

ART. XI. The Finance Committee recommended that the sum of \$300.00 be raised and appropriated on the Hunt Road.

Voted that the sum of \$300.00 be raised and appropriated on the Hunt Road for gravel resurfacing.

ART. XII. The Finance Committee recommended that the

sum of \$400.00 be raised and appropriated for the road from Stella Cheney's Corner to Walter Bartlett's.

Voted that the sum of \$400.00 be raised and appropriated for permanent construction from Stella Cheney's Corner to Walter Bartlett's.

ART. XIII. Finance Committee recommended that the sum of \$400.00 be raised for North Danville Road.

Voted that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for repairs on North Danville Road.

ART. XIV. Finance Committee recommended that the sum of \$200.00 be raised for Nichols Road.

Voted that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to continue the recent construction of the road leading from Harry S. Clark's Corner to Frederick Nichols' Poultry Farm.

ART. XV. Finance Committee recommended that the sum of \$200.00 be raised for the west side of Plains.

Voted that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to be expended for the continuance of a permanent tarvia road on the west side of Kingston Plains.

ART. XVI. Finance Committee recommended that the sum of \$450.00 be raised for this Article.

Voted that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$450 to tarvia the recent construction on Bartlett St., West and South Kingston and Scotland Street.

ART. XVII. Finance Committee recommended that this Article pass as written.

Voted that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$262.00 for breaking roads.

The Finance Committee also recommended that the Selectmen sell the unredeemed taxes.

Voted that all property, either personal or real estate, taken over by the Town for unpaid taxes by a Tax Collector's deed, that the Selectmen be authorized to sell the same at public auction to the highest bidder, advertising the same before said sale at least ten days previous to the sale, in at least four public places in the town, and that the said Selectmen shall only give a quit-claim deed.

Voted that the Town instruct the Selectmen to re-finance the series of notes which are held by the Haverhill Bank so that in the future there will be only \$1,000 payable each year plus the interest.

Voted that the Selectmen and Treasurer be authorized to borrow a sum not to exceed \$10,000 in anticipation of taxes.

Voted that the Town Treasurer and Town Clerk sit in with the Finance Committee next year and each year thereafter but have no vote.

Voted that the Town will instruct the Selectmen to purchase a check machine for the Town Treasurer and an adding machine for town officers, a sum not to exceed \$100, the same being charged to the general account.

Voted that a vote of thanks be given William Marple and James Shaw for voluntary work on roads, use of their horses, etc.

Voted that the Town pay Freeman Nason the sum of \$4.00 for pulling machines out of snow.

Motion made and carried that in the future the names of the Town and County Poor be not published in Town Report.

Voted that our Representative, Roland W. Cheney, appear before Legislative Committee in favor of bill before the House relating to Town charges having a right to vote.

Motion made and voted that Town Meeting and the time to vote on appropriations be conducted next year in the same

way as this year, which is: polls open during the day for balloting and that appropriations be taken up in the evening.

Finance Committee. Five new members were elected as follows: Warren Bakie to replace Daniel Bakie. George Austin Kemp to replace Arthur Judkins. Irving Nason to replace Simeon Clark. Frank Foster to replace John Goodwin. Edward Stevens to replace C. Charles King.

Voted to adjourn at 11:25 P. M.

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Kingston in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Kingston Town Hall in said Kingston on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing by Australian ballot, the polls to close at 6 P. M. for voting purposes, and other articles in the warrant to be taken up at 8 o'clock P. M.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
3. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for road construction, the Town to raise \$1,155.00, the State to pay \$2,310.00.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300 to put in culvert and drainage near Christie's Poultry farm, in order to give sanitary conditions and take care of surplus water in that vicinity.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100 for White Pine Blister Rust control, to be spent in co-operation with the State Forestry Department.

6. To see if the Town will vote to tarvia, patch and repair the Newton Junction Road from the Newton line to Whittier's Corner, So. Kingston and make appropriation for the same.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$200, for hose and other equipment for the Fire Department.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1500, the State to pay \$4500 for the permanent improvement of the main highway, known as the Derry Road, leading from the recent construction to the Danville line: said amount to be proportional 3 to 1.

9. On petition of Arthur R. Judkins and others: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$800, for repairs on Little River Road, so-called.

10. On petition of Walter P. Merrick and others: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1500, for repairs on Scotland Road, so called.

11. On petition of William Sjostrom and others: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$600 for gravel re-surfacing on the Hunt Road, so called.

12. On petition of Eugene N. Nason and others: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$800 for construction on the highway starting at Stella Cheney's corner and working toward Walter Bartlett's Corner.

13. On petition of Walter A. Pratt and others: To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1200 for the repairs on North Danville Road, so called.

14. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 to continue the recent construction of the road leading from Harry S. Clark's corner to Frederick Nichols' Poultry Farm.

15. On petition of Henry W. Robinson and others: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500, to be expended for the continuance of a permanent tarvia road on the West side of Kingston Plains.

16. To see if the Town will vote to tarvia the recent construction on Bartlett Street, West and South Kingston, and Scotland Street and raise and appropriate money for the same.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$262.02 for breaking roads.

18. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
