## REPORT OF TOWN MEETING, MARCH 8, 1949

Meeting was called to order at 9:10 A. M. and the warrant was read by the Moderator.

Voted to keep the Polls open until 7 o'clock.

Article 1. Proceeded to elect the Town Officers by Australian Ballot. Polls closed at 7 and the Election Officers proceeded to count the ballots.

The business meeting was called to order at 8:25 P. M. by the Moderator.

Article 2. Voted on recommendation of Finance Committee that the town raise and appropriate the sum of \$48,947.42 to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

Article 3. Voted that the town raise and appropriate the sum of \$338.47 and the State to contribute \$1,353.86 for Class V highways, under the provisions of the T. R. A. so called.

Article 4. Voted that the town raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to continue the permanent construction of the New Boston Road.

Article 5. Voted that the town raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to continue the permanent construction of Great Pond Road.

Article 6. Motion made and seconded that this Article be passed as read. Amendment made that any unexpended balance be used to move partition in Town Hall kitchen approximately five feet to make more room in the kitchen. Amendment voted and passed. Voted that the town raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for a new sink and hot water heater for the Town Hall Kitchen.

Article 7. Voted that the town raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,655.44 to cover the deficit for the construc-

tion of the new Fire House. The above sum plus interest to be covered by a note for three years, payable one-third annually after the final payment on the present notes.

Article 8. Voted that the town raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,350.00 for the expense of installing a heating system in the Fire House. The above sum plus interest to be covered by a note for three years, payable one-third annually after the final payments on the present notes.

Article 9. Voted that this article regarding the State Audit be laid on the table.

Article 10. Voted that the Selectmen be authorized to appoint a committee of three to work in conjunction with them in establishing zoning districts, rules and regulations relating thereto, the same to be presented at the next annual Town Meeting for adoption. Selectmen then appointed Arthur P. Tucker, Ralph H. Bake, William G. E. Simes as the committee.

Voted that \$400.00 of the unexpended money, if any be spent on the approaches to the Cemeteries if the law allows.

Voted that the Town borrow the sum of \$8,000.00 in anticipation of taxes.

Voted to adopt the Town Reports.

The results of the balloting under Article 1 are as follows:

Those marked with a \* were declared elected by the Moderator and the newly elected officers present took their oath of office.
