Signs, Trails:

Jeff to laminate hunter/hiker signs for Valley Lane

Muddy section of Frye Town Forest discussed again. Evy believes this may qualify for a grant from ARM (aquatic resources mitigation) for wetland restoration.

There was a discussion of posting signs needed for the new trapping ban. The signs will state "no trapping" only, citing the ordinance, and including a town contact number. Volunteers from NH Voices for Wildlife have offered to help place signs.

We still need to obtain written permission to put up the ET's Landing sign.

Planning Board, DES:

Magnusson mini mall on Rte 125. Preliminary plans. As of now, no phases approach any jurisdictional wetlands. No comment.

All American Assisted Living: The main building encroaches on the wetland buffer boundary. Several design features are also within the boundary. Evy sent comments from the CC to the Planning Board expressing concern about the encroachment, and suggesting that wildlife habitat should be considered as a mitigating factor affecting the boundary buffer.

Other business:

School projects:
