

### ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Clark House is a 2½-story, Greek Revival style house which was remodeled during the Victorian era. The sidehall entry has a 4-panelled door with one large light sheltered by a hip-roofed veranda, on the gable end facade, with a denticulated frieze and supported by square posts. All of the windows have two-over-two sash. The medium-pitch roof is topped by a narrow, corbel-capped chimney and the eaves treatment consists of a boxed cornice with a wide, molded frieze and gable-end returns. A shed-roofed porch supported by square posts has been added to the south elevation. The house rests on a brick foundation.

**RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT:** On the east elevation of the main block is an attached 1-story shed. A separate 1½-story, gable-roofed barn is located to the southeast. It has clapboard siding and rests on a stone foundation. An attached shed projects from its east elevation. Two more sheds are located to the east of the barn.

**BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION:** 1.9 acres bounded to the N-Speliliotis, Clark, S-Malloy, E-Clark, W-Main Street.

### STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (Evaluation & Historical Associations):

A typical vernacular Greek Revival house in reasonably good repair and still in its original setting. Buildings of this period reflect the continued growth of Kingston in the 19th century.

#### Historic Associations:

House formerly owned by Henry Howard and John Clark. John was a tinsmith who peddled tin all over the area from a wagon.
