

ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The King House is a 1-story Bungalow style structure with wood-shingle wall covering. The center entry has a 4-panel door with an oval light and dentils, and is sheltered by a built-in porch with engaged, tapering columns. All windows are two-over-one. The medium-pitched ridge-type hip roof has exposed rafters. It is topped by one tall, narrow chimney, and it has a hip-roofed dormer on the south side.

An ell has the same siding, eaves treatment, windows, and foundation as the main block.

BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION: 1.5 acres bounded to the N-Carson, S-McDonald, E-McDonald, Doncaster, W-Newton Junction Road, Carson.

The King House is a fine example of early 20th century Bungalow style building. The house has survived without major alteration to the main block and therefore is an important historic and architectural contribution to the district.
