

ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Stukas house is a 1 1/2 story, Bungalow style structure. The center entry has a 1-paneled door with one large light which has dentils applied below. The entrance is sheltered by a 1 story, 2 bay enclosed porch which has been incorporated into the main block. Above the entry is a 2 bay, shed dormer. Both the porch and shed dormer have exposed rafters along the roofline. All of the windows on the main block have two over two sash. The steeply pitched roof is topped by a narrow corbel capped chimney, and the roofline has projecting eaves. A fieldstone foundation supports the main block. To the east of the main block is a 1 story, shed roofed, enclosed porch with exposed rafters, wood shingle siding, fixed four pane windows, a new door, and a brick and stone foundation.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT:

A separate 1 story tile roofed garage is located to the north of the main block.

BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION: 12 Acres. Bounded to the N. by Lone Tree Council, E. by Lone Tree Council, W. by the Wheelands and Rt. 125, S. by West Shore Road and Lone Tree Council.

REFERENCES:**STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (Evaluation & Historical Associations):**

The Stukas House is a fine example of the Bungalow style. It is attractively sited on a knoll and contributes historic interest to the streetscape of rapidly developing Route 125.
