



ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Lake House is a 1½-story Greek Revival style structure. The center entry door is sheltered by a 1-story, gable-roofed, enclosed porch on a stone foundation. All windows are six-over-six. The medium-pitched roof is topped by one end-placed chimney, and the eaves treatment consists of a boxed cornice with gable end returns visually supported by cornerboards.

A 1-story shed-roofed porch is located on the east elevation. It has clapboard siding and rests on a cement foundation.

The West Kingston Schoolhouse is historically important in this small town center.
