

ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Greenwood House is a 1/2-story Federal Cape style structure which has had the center chimney replaced with two stove chimneys. The 4-panelled center entry door contains four lights, and is flanked by pilasters which rise to meet a recessed panel. All windows have nine-over-nine sash and architrave trim. Eaves treatment consists of a boxed cornice on the lateral eaves and close raking eaves.

A recent 1-story, gable-roofed ell rests on a cement foundation. It has clapboard siding and six-over-six windows.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT: One separate shed-roofed shed has wood shingle siding.

BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION: 1 acre bounded to the N-Bake, S-Scotland Road, E-Lambathas, W-Quigley.

The W. Webster House is a fine example of a cape built in the Federal style. It relates to Sites 112 and 114 which are strikingly similar. These three structures may have been built by the same builder.
