STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE:

If this property is reviewed in the future, additional documentation would be required.

Concur with the consultant: this property appears to be eligible for National Register listing, both individually and as a contributing structure within the Newton Junction Road Historic District. The consultant identifies it as "one of the best examples of a small, mid-nineteenth century, Greek Revival sidehall in Kingston," enriched by retention of its English barn, and comparing favorably with other examples in the town center. The consultant also notes that it was the home of Lawrence Barrett, the immigrant Irish carpenter who built at least three houses (including this one) in the Newton Junction Road Historic District, and as such may offer "significant information about his building practice." The consultant dates the English barn to c. 1800, predating the house, and suggests that it may have originally been associated with one of the Webster properties in the South Kingston neighborhood.
