Kathy began a garden this year and has noticed a proliferation of dragonflies!



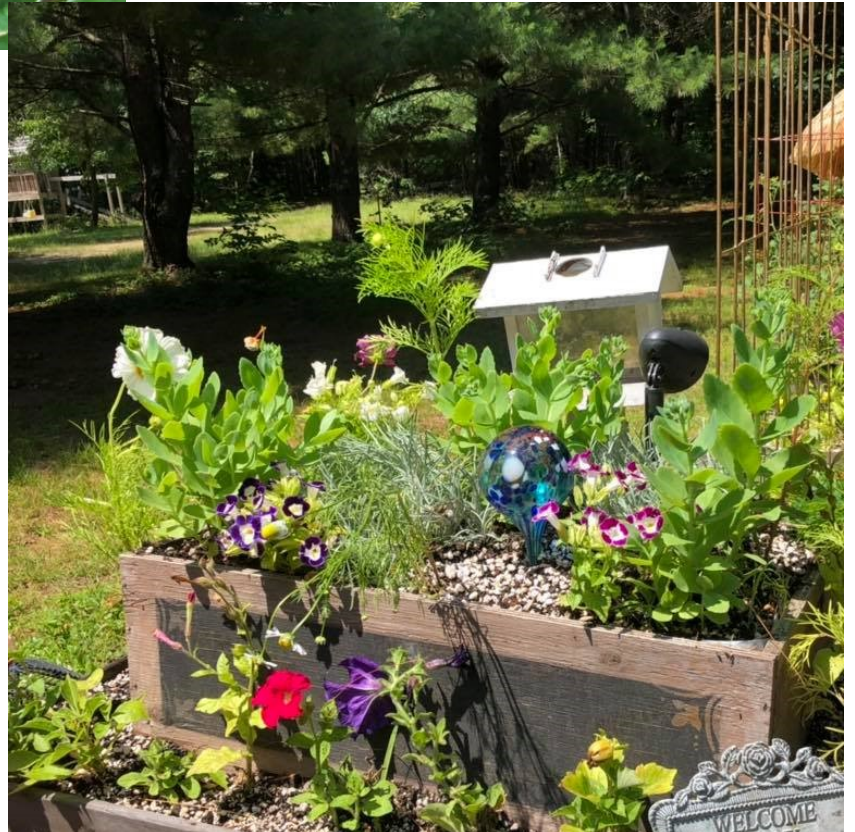
Jennifer Dervan's little guy saved this butterfly from the ants. It stayed on his cheek for an hour! Another pollinator hero!
