Tracy Degnan of Rockingham County Conservation District came to report regarding her walk at Frye with Evy. She also presented an estimate for spraying invasives on the blue trail, where we found lots of bittersweet and some remaining barberry. After a short discussion, the board felt we should go ahead with this Issues at Frye have been put off for long enough. The estimate for a total of \$1,300 was presented. We will use forest fund funds for what is not covered by the line item for professional services.

Marghi Bean made a motion to accept RCCD's proposal. Ken Twombly seconded. All were in favor.

After the invasives are treated we will work to arrange a volunteer day to cut the new section of trail where it becomes a flood plain in spring and early summer. Ms. Degnan suggested using the Nature Groupie (UNH) site to call for volunteers.

Mr. Kaiser then spoke on the need to create boat channels on Powwow Pond. Though the milfoil is well under control, the natives have grown in too thickly to allow boaters to get out into the pond. We reviewed the DES permit application. Mr. Senko suggested that language should be changed to mandate removal and composting of plant material. Following this the CC voted to sign the application.
