Wednesday, March 31, 2021

#### Secretary's Report

Minutes for March 3, 2021 – Approved – Evy made a motion to approve, Elizabeth seconds – all were in favor.

#### New Business

- What is the status of the KCC zoom account? Elizabeth said it is less expensive to get our own account for \$149.99 vs going through the town it would be \$15/mo. We could see if we could have a conservation commission license and share with them. Will be discussed at the next CC meeting.
