Minutes: Minutes from the December 12, 2012. The tape from the meeting did not record properly so Virginia typed a summary of the meeting based on the agenda. Board Updates: Planning Board, Glenn Coppelman- He stated that the Board is finalizing zoning article amendments to present to the voters, including noise standards for commercial zones and livestock ordinances. He deferred to Stanley Shalett who stated that there are no new applications of significance. Judy Rubin asked about the progress of Sad Café reviewing St. Frederick's Church as a possible new location. Glenn stated that the site plan approval process was never concluded.

Board of Selectmen, George Korn- He stated that they have met several times with the Museum Committee regarding the archiving project. The Board of Selectmen has decided to support their request for funds and have presented to the KM Budget Committee. The KMBC have voiced the opinion that the request for funds should be presented to the town as a Warrant Article. He stated that the Warrant Article has been prepared and is being reviewed. He added that the Museum Committee and Library are prepared to present information to the KMBC again at the Deliberative Session in hopes that the funded would be approved at that time. George stated that there is also the probability of a Warrant Article being presented for the Heritage Commission. The Commission discussed the Budget Committee's Public Hearing scheduled for January 12th and the information that was discussed at the prior meeting.

CIP, Glenn Coppelman- Subcommittee met in December. He stated that at that time most department submittals had been received. He stated that the next step is to map out the submittals over the next six year period to spread out the corresponding costs.

Museum Task Force/ Library- Virginia stated that the next meeting is on January 9th.
