Kingston, New Hampshire Board of Selectmen Meeting of February 10, 2014 MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 pm in the Selectmen's Office of the Kingston Town Hall. In attendance were Chairman Mark Heitz and Selectmen Peter Broderick and George Korn.

Non-public Session

MOTION: Upon motion of Selectman Korn and second of Selectman Broderick, Chairman Heitz polled the Board for a unanimous vote to retire to non-public session under the provisions of NH RSA 91-A:3. II-c. The Board retired at 7:02 pm.

The Board returned to public session at 7:20 pm.

MOTON: Upon motion of Selectman Korn and second of Selectman Broderick, Chairman Heitz polled the Board for a unanimous vote to seal the minutes of the non-public session for an indeterminate period.

Administrative Issues

The Board discussed a February 4th meeting of the Recreation Commission attended by Selectmen Korn and Broderick. Another meeting will be held on February 11th.

An Elderly Exemption application for 2014 was reviewed and approved.

A request from the Historic District Commission to consider a letter of support for a potential buyer of the Country Store building on Main Street was considered. It was agreed that town Boards should not provide support to private sale arrangements.

A request to erect a sign in front of the Grace Daley House asking for support of Warrant Article 14 was denied in keeping with the town's policy to not allow political signs on town property.

A letter of support for a Southeast Land Trust application for grant funding to expand the trails system throughout the French, Tucker and Meadowsend properties off of Tucker Road was signed.

Review of Previous Meeting Minutes

MOTION: Upon motion of Selectman Broderick and second of Selectman Heitz it was voted to accept the minutes of the February 10, 2014 meeting as printed. Selectman Korn abstained from the vote.

MOTION: Upon motion of Selectman Broderick and second of Selectman Heitz it was voted to accept the minutes of the February 10, 2014 Non-public session as printed. Selectman Korn abstained from the vote.

YMCA Training Proposal Discussed

It was agreed that the Director of Camp Lincoln will be invited to attend the February 24th meeting, along with members of the Recreation Commission, to discuss the YMCA proposal to develop a Summer Recreation program and provide education and training for staff.
