## ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Ferrier house is a 1½-story structure built in the late-nineteenth century, which displays Greek Revival characteristics including gable front orientation to the street, sidehall entry, and classical door treatment. The sidehall entry has a multipanelled door with two lights, flanked by pilasters rising to a full entablature. On the main facade is a flat-roofed, 1-story, open porch supported by square posts and attached to a 1-story, 3-sided, bay window with a panelled frieze and one-over-one and two-over-two windows.

All of the windows on the main block have two-over-two sash framed by architrave trim. The medium-pitched roof is topped by a narrow chimney and the eaves treatment consists of a boxed cornice with a wide frieze and gable-end returns. The house rests on a brick foundation.

The 1-story, gable-roofed ell has a shed-roofed enclosed porch on its south elevation. It rests on a fieldstone foundation and the roof is topped by a narrow, corbel-capped chimney.
