



ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:
A turn-of-the-century vernacular structure, the Clements House features a gable roof with five shed-roofed dormers. The central entry door has four (recessed) panels and one large light, and is sheltered by a 1 story shed roofed enclosed porch. Windows are two over two. The low pitched roof is topped by one chimney with a corbeled cap. The house has a molded cornice.
RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT: There is a shed roofed shed to the SE.
BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION: 1 Acre. Bounded to the N. by Sanborn, E. by Depot Rd. S. by Bake, and Killam, W. by the Cemetary.
