

	ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION: The Magnusson House is a 2, story Colonial Revival style structure. The two matching center entry doors each have four panels with two lights and are shelter by a hipped-roof porch supported by square posts. The porch is lined by a railing of squ balusters. The first floor front facade windows are eight-over eight and the rest are six-over-siz, most with shutters. The cornice treatment consists of projecting lateral and raking eaves with fascia boards but no soffits. The medium-pitched roof is topped by two central chimneys, and there is an exterior chimney to the South.	are
