

ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL A	ND STRUCTURAL	DESCRIPTION:
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The French house is a 1%-story Cape built in the Greek Revival style. The offset entry has a 4-panelled door flanked by full-length sidelights. All of the windows have six-over-six sash. The medium-pitch roof is topped by two, tall, narrow, corbel-capped chimneys. The eaves treatment consists of a boxed cornice with gable-end returns. A small, six-over-six window is located in the gable. The house rests on a brick foundation The 1-story, shed-roofed ell has clapboard siding and rests on stone.
