ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Impey house is a late Greek Revival style structure. Entry via open porch which leads to one story shed-roofed enclosed porch that is supported by square columns with capitals. The multi-light door has sidelights extending its full height. Windows are six-over-six with caps, and the windows on the front and north facade are framed by shutters. The medium-pitched roof is topped by two chimneys with corbel-caps, and the eaves treatment is a boxed cornice with a wide frieze and gable-end returns supported by pilasters.

Two 1-story, gable-roofed ells both have clapboard siding, a boxed cornice, and six-over-six windows. One has a stone foundation and the other has a concrete foundation and is attached bo the barn.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (Evaluation & Historical Associations):

The O. P. Nichols House is an excellent example of the Greek Revival style. Several of the district's houses are similar in design. The recessed entry is particularly nice.

Historic Associations: The house belonged to influential Nichols family for many years. Then it belonged to Mr. & Mrs. Nathanial Parker who came to Kingston from Scotland. c.1870. Their son, Frank, built house at Site #100 when he married Alice Holt of Epping.
