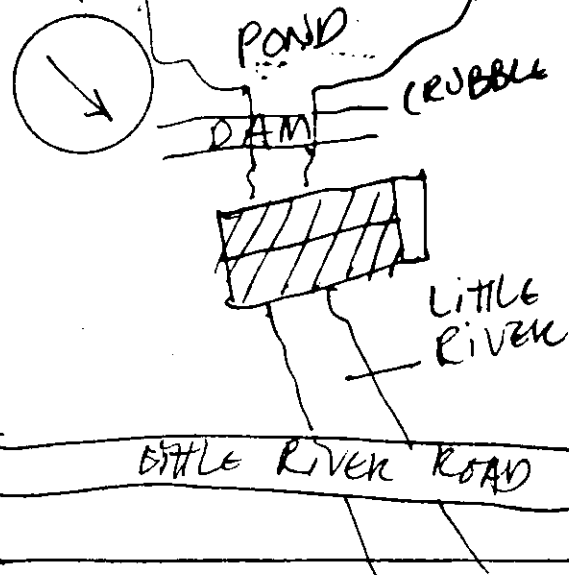

ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

1½ story vertical board, rectangular building used a mill until c.1900
Shingles in gable
Wood shingle gable roof
Shed
Several small paned single sash windows.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT:

Dam and water wheel gone.
Upper pond gone 40-50 years but coming back.

BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION:

Possibly the original grant of 1705; 100 acres voted by Town to anyone who would set up a mill.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (Evaluation & Historical Associations):

The Judkins Mill is significant both visually and historically in the Little River District. The District grew up because of this mill, and the site maintains important associations of the district's history.

Historic Associations: Owned and operated by Judkins family continuously from 1737 through Arthur Judkins, c.1935. Grist mill. In 1705, 100 acres granted to Judkins to operate mill. Dammed the upper pond. (See Site # 12, District 2 for more information.)
