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ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION: The Federhen house is a  $2\frac{1}{2}$  story, central chimney Georgian style structure featuring graduated, feathered clapboard wall covering on the main block. The 6 panelled center entry door is surmounted by transom lights and flanked by pilasters which rise to meet a full entablature. Windows have two over two, and nine over six sash, all with arachitrave trim. The low pitched roof is topped by a massive central chimney, and the cornice treatment consists of close raking eaves, and a boxed cornice on the lateral eaves. A l story, shed roofed, open porch to the southeast is supported by square columns. A 2 story gable roofed ell rests on a fieldstone foundation. It has a 6 panelled door surmounted by transom lights, and windows with nine over six sash. A l story, shed roofed open porch to the northwest is supported by square columns. A 1 story shed roofed wing rests on a fieldstone foundation. It has a . 6 panelled door flanked by fluted pilasters and surmounted by a peaked transom. It has windows with

nine over six sash framed by architrave trim.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT: A separate  $l_{\overline{z}}^{1}$  story, gable-roofed barn to the northwest rests on a fieldstone foundation and has wood shingle siding. It has an attached 1 story gable roofed shed to the northeast.

A separate 1 story, gable roofed shed to the southwest has a vertical board door, and wood shingle siding.

BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION: 50 Acres. Bounded to the N. by Phillips, and Magnusson, E. by Little River Road, S. by Gould and LaBranche, W. by Magnuson.
