ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION: The Briggs house is a 22 story, central chimney, Georgian style house. The 6 panelled center entry door is flanked by full height sidelights and pilasters which rise to meet a full entablature. Windows have nine over six sash on the first story and six over six on the second story, all with architrave trim. The low pitched roof is topped by two chimneys, one with a corbeled cap. Cornice treatment consists of close raking eaves and a boxed cornice on the lateral eaves. A 1 story, gable roofed ell rests on a concrete foundation. It has the same siding and eaves treatment as the main block, a large chimney, and an attached 1 story, gable roofed enclosed entry porch. There is a 1 story, hip roofed open porch attached to the main block.
