ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION: The Phillips house is a $2\frac{1}{2}$ story, central chimney, Georgian style structure. The 6 panelled center entry door is surmounted by a transom light containing "Bullseye" glass, and pillasters rise to meet a full entablature with a pediment motif. Windows have six over six sash. The medium pitched roof is topped by a massive, corbel-capped chimney, and the eaves treatment consists of a boxed cornice. A 1 story hip-roofed ell rests on a foundation of fieldstone and granite blocks. It has

nine over six windows, and a 2 panelled door containing two vertical lights. It has wood shingle wall covering on the rear elevation and clapboards on the rest. Eaves treatment consists of a boxed cornice.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT: There is a large, attached, 1 story gable roofed shed, and a separate l_2 story gable roofed shed. Also a gable roofed barn with wood shingle siding.

BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION: 38.3 Acres. Bounded to the N. by Connell, and Phillips E. by Briggs, S. by Rent, and Little River Road West, W. by Connell.

The John Page House is a fine example of vernacular Georgian architecture, finely preserved; it makes a significant architectural and historic contribution to the Little River District.

Historic Associations: Much farm land; probably sold lumber to sawmill; may have been stop on Underground Railroad; was tavern at one time; John Page had a carriage shop here on site of garage.
