



## ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Nicker house is a lastory vernacular structure. The sidehall entry door is sheltered by a lastory shed-roofed open porch which is supported by square columns, and has a denticulated frieze. Windows have both two-over-one and two-over-two sash, all with denticulated caps. There are two 2-bay shed dormers with projecting eaves and denticulated friezes. The medium pitched roof of the main block is topped by a chimney with a corbelled cap. Cornice treatment consists of projecting lateral and raking eaves. The lastory gable roofed wing has the same eaves treatment as the main block, and a corbel-capped chimney. A lastory ell has a brick foundation.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT: A large 1 story gable roofed barn rests on a field-stone foundation. It has asphalt shingle siding, a boxed cornice, and windows with six-over-six sash.

There are also two seperate small sheds.
