

**ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:**

The Prenaveau House is a 1½-story, gable-roofed, vernacular structure. The entrance is the west facade and has a 4-panelled door which is sheltered by a 1-story, shed-roofed enclosed porch. The windows on the main block have two-over-one sash. A narrow, corbel-capped chimney tops the medium-pitch roof and the eaves treatment consists of a boxed cornice. The house is supported by a fieldstone foundation.

A 1-story, shed-roofed wing projects to the west. It has two-over-two windows and rests on a fieldstone foundation. The 1-story, gable-roofed ell has aluminum siding, two-over-one windows, a narrow corbel-capped chimney, and a fieldstone foundation. A second 1-story, gable-roofed ell extends to the rear of the first. It has new windows, aluminum siding, and rests on a concrete block foundation.

**RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT:** A separate 1-story, gable-roofed shed is located to the west of the main block. It has clapboard siding, one-over-one windows, and a vertical-board door.

**BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION:** 2.5 acres bounded to the N-Prenaveau, S-Smith, E-Rte. 125, W-Young.
