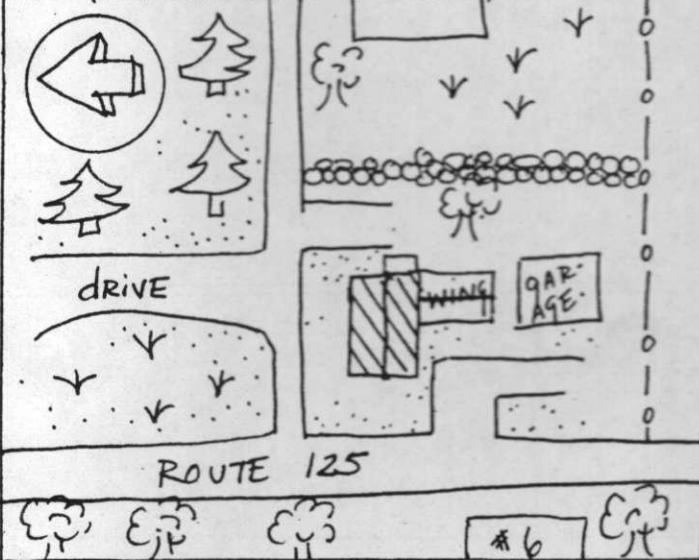

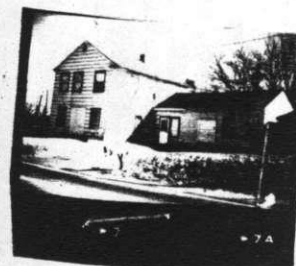

ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Standing House is a 2½-story, gabled-roofed, vernacular structure which has been altered by the addition of asbestos shingle siding. The entrance is sheltered by a 1-story, shed-roofed, enclosed porch, located on the east elevation. The main block has two-over-two and one-over-one windows. The medium-pitched roof is topped by a narrow, corbel-capped chimney and the roofline has a boxed cornice on the lateral eaves and close raking eaves. The structure rests on a fieldstone foundation.

A 1-story, gable-roofed wing projects to the south. It has clapboard siding, 12-over-12 and two-over-two windows, a multi-light door, and a fieldstone foundation. Post and beam construction is evident in this wing.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT: A separate 1-story, gable-roofed garage is located to the south of the house.

BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION: .2 acres bounded to the N-Newton Junction Road, S-Lavoie, E-Lavoie, W-Route 125.
