

ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION: This ly story frame house features at a kery premided hip-roofed tower on the southeast corner. It is torred by a corper finial. The main block has a multi-panel and light sidehall entry door with a door/hoo's supported by decorative insolets. All the analows have two-over-one and and projecting dimes capa. The sedime, stoned roof is topped by one tall chimney with a corboled cap, and the capa treatment is a bound cornice with slight gable end returns and a wide friend. All story gable-roofed wing to the southeast has the same doundation, widing, windows, and eaves treatment as the main block. It has a multi-panel door with one harpe light.
A 1_ ctory galde-roofed ell to the continent had the core foundation, alding windows, door and enven treatment as the main block.
