

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ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Mayhew Mouse is a Z-story, Bungalow style structure which has had itd architectural integrity altered by the addition of a second plong (c.1979). The entrance is sheltered by a Z-clory, hip-roofed, enclosed porch, locate, on the front facado. The porch has exposed rafters, wood shingle siding, six-over-one windows, and a New multiplicate door.

The first story of the main block has the same windows as the borch. The second story is a new addition with one-over-one windows and a low-nitched sable-roof with a boxed cornice on the lateral eaves and close raking eaves. The main block is supported by a rusticated granite block foundation.

A 1-story, hip-roofed, enclosed porch is located on the northeast elevation. The 1-story, gable-roofed ell has exposed rafters, coop chingle siding, new three-over-three windows, and a concrete block foundation.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT: A separate 4-story, gable-roofed shed in located to the northeast of the main block. It has wood shingle slding, fixed 45 mane windows, and a fieldstone foundation. A 4-story, gable-roofed garage in located to the east of the main block.

BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION: 1.1 acres bounded to the N-Newton, NH. N-Newton Junction Road, N-Parahon, J-Coborne.
