

## ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Fellows House is a vernacular house built around the turn of the century. The center entry door has four panels with a large light surrounded by small lights, and is sheltered by small, 1-ctory porch supported by square wooder columns. All windows are two-over-two. The medium-pitched roof is topped by one chimney with a combeled can, and the eaves treatment consists of a boxed cornice with pable end returns.

A 1-story, gable-roofed ell has the same windows, foundation, and eave treatment as the main block.

A 4-story, shed-roofed worch had a cement block foundation, large one-over-one windows, and the same siding and enver treatment as the main block. A bay window is located next to the front morph.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT: Nodern A-oer garage has 1-story shed on mide.

BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION: .5 sores bounded to the M-Newton Junction Road, S-Fellows, M-Fellows.
