

#### ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Fellows House is a vernacular house built around the turn of the century. The center entry door has four panels with a large light surrounded by small lights, and is sheltered by small, 1-story porch supported by square wooden columns. All windows are two-over-two. The medium-pitched roof is topped by one chimney with a corbeled cap, and the eave treatment consists of a boxed cornice with gable end returns.

A 1-story, gable-roofed ell has the same windows, foundation, and eave treatment as the main block.

A 1-story, shed-roofed porch has a cement block foundation, large one-over-one window, and the same siding and eave treatment as the main block. A bay window is located next to the front porch.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT: Modern 2-car garage has 1-story shed on side.

BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION: .5 acres bounded to the N-Newton Junction Road, S-Fellows, E-Fellows, W-Fellows.
