

ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION: The King House is a 1-story Bungalow style structure with wood-shingle wall covering The center entry has a 1-panel door with an oval light and dentils, and is sheltered by a built-in porch with engaged, tavering columns. All windows are two-over-one. The medium-pitched ridge-type him roof has exposed rafters. It is topped by one fall, narrow chimney, and it has a hip-roofed dormer on the south side. An ell has the same siding, eaves treatment, windows, and foundation as the main block.
