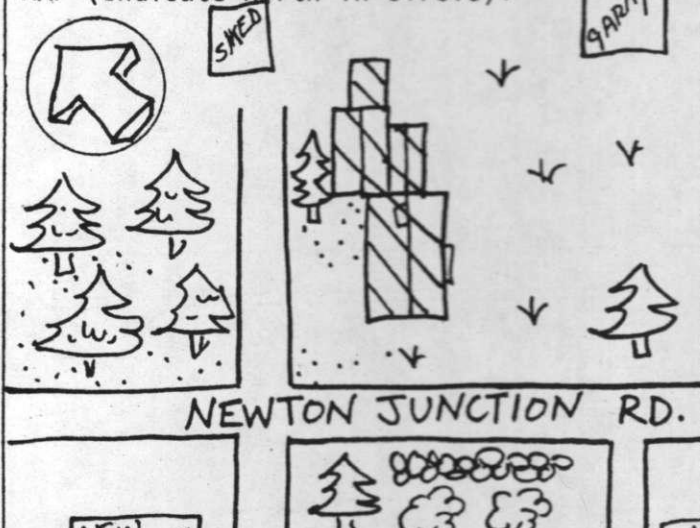

ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Carruthers house is a 1 1/2 story, gable-roofed, vernacular structure. The side ell is one story, gable-roofed, and has a small porch. The main ell is one story, gable-roofed, and has a small porch. The main ell is topped by a narrow corbel capped chimney, and the roofline has a boxed cornice with a plain frieze and a sloped soffit along the lateral eaves. A fieldstone foundation supports the structure. The one story, gable-roofed ell has clapboard siding, one over one windows, and a fieldstone foundation.

The entrance is sheltered by a one story, shed roofed enclosed porch. To the rear of this ell is a one story, shed roofed ell with wood shingle siding, recent one-over-one windows and a cement foundation. A second 1-story, gable roofed ell extends to the northeast and has clapboard siding, two-over-two windows, and a cement foundation.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT: To the north of the main block is a separate 1-story, gable-roofed shed. To the southeast of the main block is a separate 1-story, gable roofed garage.

BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION: 2.4 Acres. Bounded to the N. by land of True and Barrett, S. by land of Peltenovich, E. by land of Barrett, and Frouty, W. by Newton Junction Road.
