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This vernacular house has a modified gable roof. The center entry has a 6-panel door. All of the main block windows are two-over-two. Cornice treatment consists of close raking eaves, and a sloped soffit on the lateral eaves. The 1-story, gable-roofed wing rests on a cement foundation. It has clapboard siding, six-over-six windows, and an exterior chimney.
<b>RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT:</b> A large gable-roofed barn rests on a fieldstone found- ation. It has a horizontally sliding vertical-board door, and an attached shed on either side.
Another. 1-story gable-roofed shed has clauboard siding.
