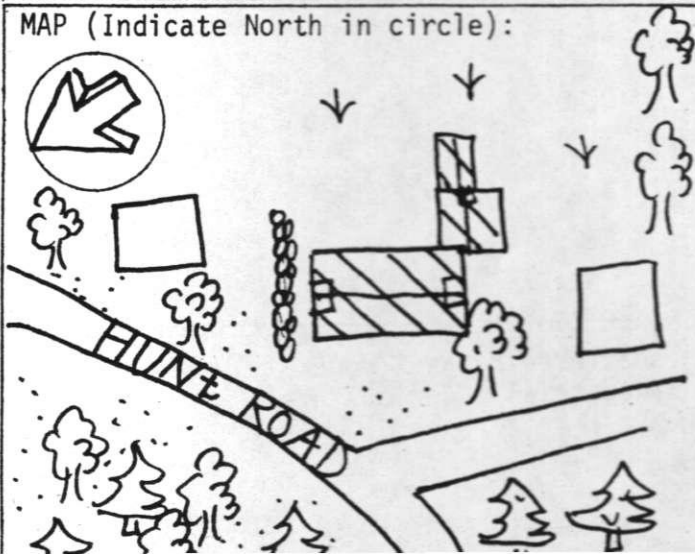

ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Bradley house is a 1 story, twin chimney Cape with Federal and Greek Revival characteristics. The center entry has a 4 panelled door flanked by full sidelights. All of the windows on the main block have nine over six sash and are framed by shutters. The low pitched roof is topped by twin narrow chimneys and the roofline has close raking and lateral eaves. A fieldstone foundation supports the main block. The 1 story gable roofed ell has clapboard siding, a 3 panelled door with one large light, six over six windows and a fieldstone foundation. A second 1 story, gable roofed ell extends to the rear of the first. It has clapboard siding, fixed six pane windows, and a fieldstone foundation.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT: A separate 1 story, gable roofed garage is located to the southwest of the main block.

BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION: 11 Acres. Bounded to the N. by Cameron, and Chamberlain, E. by Chamberlain, E. by Shaw, W. by Dorro Road.

The E. Jones House is a vernacular cape built between 1800 and 1830 showing the influence of the Federal and Greek Revival styles. Its facade has been changed and much of its detail is no longer evident.
