

## ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Lafayette House is a vernacular structure built in the late 19th century. The sidehall entry has a 4-panel door with one large light, and a door hood that is supported by ornamental brackets with pendants. Windows are two-over-one and two-over-two, with architrave trim. Eaves treatment is a boxed cornice.

There is a 1-story, shed-roofed porch on the south facade of the main block. It has large, new windows, and the same siding and eaves treatment as the main block.

The two ells were added separately, but have the same features, including two-over-two windows with shutters, a gable-roofed, a boxed cornice and a fieldstone foundation.

There are two new wings. Both are 1-story, with shed roofs and concrete block foundations.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT: A 1½-story, gable-roofed barn has an attached shed-roofed shed. The old store on the premises is one story, with a gable roof, two-over-one windows, wood shingle siding, and projecting lateral eaves. An attached ell has a fixed 6-light window, and a tall, corbel-capped chimney.

BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION: 2 acres bounded to the N-Swallow, S-Senter, W-Senter, E-Mill Road.

Typical example of vernacular, low cost housing in the last quarter of the 19th century. Detailing minimal save for the Italianate door hood. Store building typical of early 20th century roadside development.

Adjoining building was a store until c.1975.
