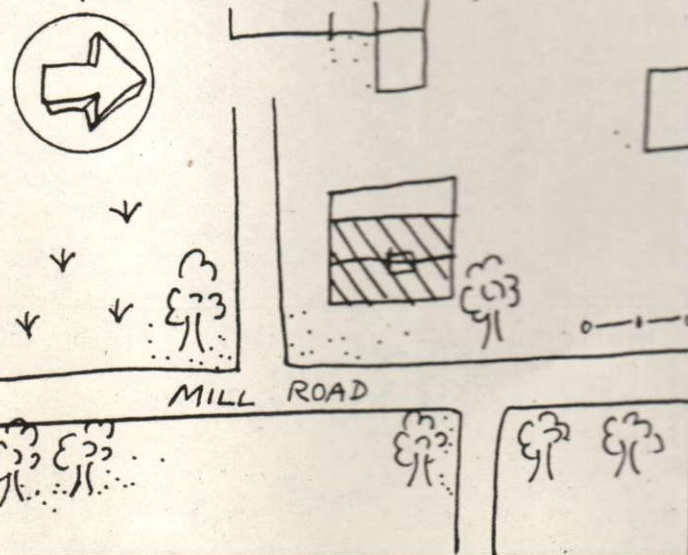

#### ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Senter House is a 1½-story vernacular structure. The center entry door has four panels and one large light. Windows are two-over-two, except in the gables, which have six-over-two windows. The medium-pitched roof is topped by a corbel-capped chimney, and the eaves treatment consists of a boxed cornice.

A 1-story, shed-roofed ell has clapboard and wood shingle siding, two-over-two windows, and a 4-panelled door with one large light.

**RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT:** A separate 1-story, gable-roofed shed/garage has a vertical-board door, asphalt shingle siding, and a fieldstone foundation. It has an attached 1-story shed to the northwest.

There is another, large, 1-story gable-roofed shed to the west.

**BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION:** .2 acres bounded to the N-Lafayette, S-McClare, E-Mill Road, W-Senter.
