

ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Holt house is a 1 story, mid nineteenth century house built in the Greek Revival style and featuring a large veranda, (later addition), gable front orientation to the street, and classical ornamentation. The sidehall entry has a 4 panelled door with one light framed by full height sidelights. Flanking these are pilasters which rise to a pediment motif. The entrance is heeltered by a 1 story, hip-roofed veranda which extends along the front facade and southwest elevation. All of the windows have two over one sash topped by projecting caps. The medium pitched roof is topped by two narrow, corbel-capped chimneys and the eaves treatment consists of a boxed cornice (with a sloped soffit along the lateral eaves) and a wide frieze. The main block is framed by narrow pilasters.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT: To the west of the house is a 1 story, gable roofed barn which has obsploated iding, evertical board door, the over six and fixed six pero windows, and rests on a fieldstone foundation. It has an attached 1 story shed. To the southwest of the house is a separate 1 story gable roofed shed.
