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ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The McGlynn house is a 21 story, gable roofed Italianate style structure characterized by a bracketed doorhood and eaves. The sidehall entry has double-leaf, 3 panelled doors, each with one round-arched light. It is sheltered by a hip-roofed doorhood supported by heavy, Italianate brackets with errorental drop pendents. On the front freeds is a 2 story, flat roofed, bey window with nerrow, one over one lights and bracketed eaves. All of the windows have two over two sash framed by shutters and projecting caps. On the east elevation is a 1 story, hip roofed, open porch with the elevate supported by equate, buick posts. The weakle pitched roof is to get by entry, correct correct chirney at the roofline last boral cornics and brackets and returns. The main block is framed by nerrow pilesters. A brick and stone foundation supports the structure.

The 1. story, gable roofed ell has clapboard siding, two over two windows with shutters and a fieldstone foundation. It has shed dormers on its east and west elevations and a 1 story, flat roofed, bay window on its east elevation. The medium pitched gable roof is topped by a narrow, corbel capped chimney and the roofline has the same brackets as the main block.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT: Projecting from the north elevation of the ell is a high story, gable-roofed barn with clapboard siding, two over two windows framed by shutters, bracketed eaves, a sliding vertical board door, and a fieldstone foundation. A 1 story gable roofed garage is attached to the east side of the barn. A separate 1 story, gable
