

ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Loick house is a lostory, Greek Revival style structure which has been remodled, including the addition of a lostory, hip roofed, enclosed porch on its west elevation. Greek Revival characteristics include gable front orientation to the street and a sidehall entry door surmounted by a partial entablature. All of the windows are recent with two over one sash and projecting caps. The medius pitched roof is topped by narrow, corbel-capped chimney and the eaves treatment consists of a boxed cornice with a wide frieze and gable end returns. The house rests on a granite slab foundation. The lostory gable roofed ell has clapboard siding, two over one windows with projecting caps and rests on a granite slab foundation. The lostory, shed roofed ell has clapboard siding, two over two windows and rests on a fieldstone foundation.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT:

To the north of the house are two 1 story gable roofed sheds.

BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION: .9 Acres. Bounded to the N. by Woodworth, S. by Danville Road, E. by the land of the Lakes, W by Ball Road.
