

ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Sweetland house is a 2 story Italianate style structure which has been altered by the addition of asbestos shingle siding. The center entry has a multi-panelled door with one large light. It is sheltered by a shell roofed doorhood an ported by square brackets. Most of the windows have two over one sash framed by architrave trim. Two narrow one over one windows are located above the entrance. A 2 story bay window with narrow one over one lights is located on the front facade. The steeply pitched roof is topped by a narrow, corbel capped chimney and the roofline has a boxed cornice with gable end returns. A brick foundation supports the main block.

A 1 story shed roofed enclosed porch is located on the east elevation of the main block. The 1 story gable roofed ell has asbestos shingle siding, two over two windows framed by architrave trim, and 6 panelled doors. The roof is topped by a narrow chimney and the

structure is supported by a brick and fieldstone foundation.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT: To the northwest of the main block is a separate lastory, gable roofed barn with board and batten siding, fixed six pane windows, a sliding vertical board door, and a concrete block foundation.
