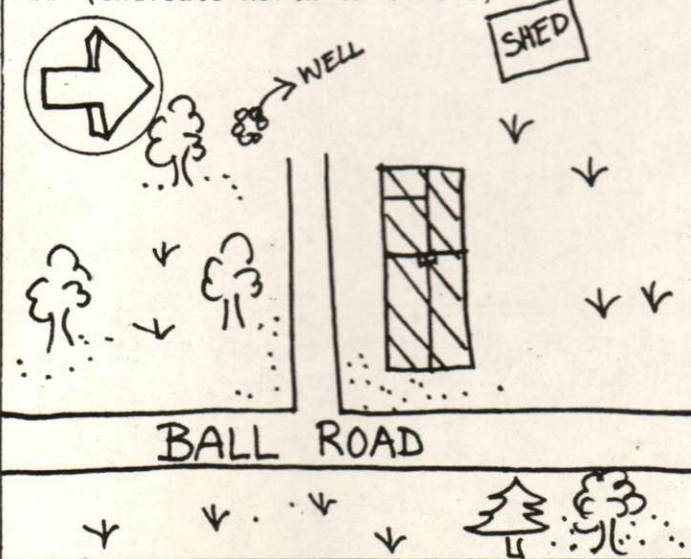

ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Nason house is a 1½ story, Greek Revival style structure characterized by gable front orientation to the street and a recessed sidehall entry. A 4 panelled door is located within the entrance which has a square free standing column with a capital. All of the windows have six over six sash. The medium pitched roof is topped by a narrow corbel capped chimney and the roofline has a boxed cornice with a wide frieze and gable end returns. The main block is framed by wide pilasters. The 1½ story gable roofed ell has clapboard siding, two over two windows, and a 3 panelled door with one large light. On the south elevation of the ell is a 1 story, shed roofed, open porch supported by turned posts.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT:

Two separate 1 story, gable roofed sheds in a state of near ruins, are located to the northwest of the main block.

BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION: 5 Acres. Bounded to the N. by Brusson S. by Nason & Dunn, E. by Ball Road, W. by Nason.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (Evaluation & Historical Associations):

The G. Winslow House is quite unusual in that the southeastern corner has been removed to form a recessed entry. The original cornerpost and pillaster remain standing.
