

ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Battles House is a 1½-story Federal Cape style structure. The center entry. has a new 4-panel door with one large light. All windows are two-over-two. Cornice treatment consists of close raking eaves and boxed, molded, lateral eaves. The medium-pitched roof is topped by two end-placed chimneys.

A 1-story shed-roofed shed along the north elevation has clapboard siding, twoover-two windows, and close eaves.

A 1½-story gable-roofed wing has the same siding, windows, cornice treatment, and foundation as the main block. It has an attached 1-story shed-roofed open porch on a cement foundation.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT: An attached 1/2-story gable-roofed barn has clapboard siding, and asphalt sheeting on the roof.

BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION: .6 acres bounded to the N-Smith, S-Main Street, E-Wunderlich, W-Aldred.
