ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Toledo house is a mid-nineteenth century vernacular structure. The sidehall entry has a recent door sheltered by a 1 story, shed roofed open porch. All of the windows have two over two and six over six sash. A 2 bay, shed dormer is located on the southeast facade. The house rests on a fieldstone foundation. A 1 story, gable roofed wing projects to the northwest. It has a 1 story wing on its northwest elevation.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT: A separate 1 story, gable roofed shed is located to the northeast of the house.

BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION: .8 Acres. Bounded to the N and W. by Nason, S. by Mahon, and Rocky Hill Realty, E. by Reynolds.
