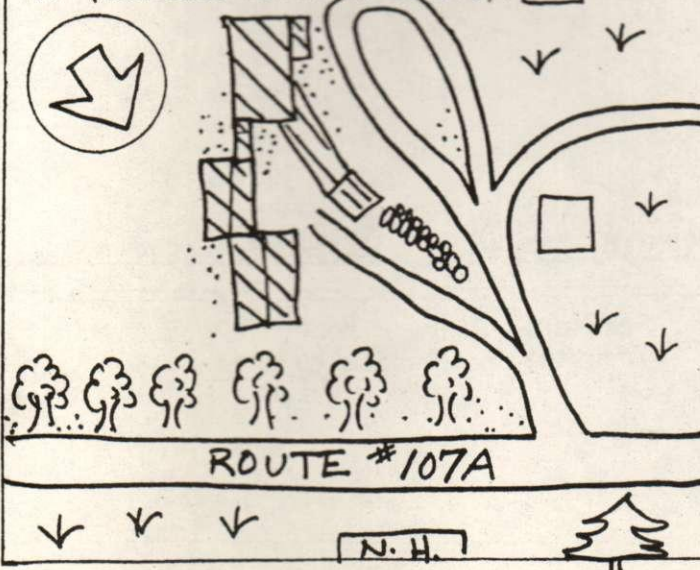

ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Bakie House is a 2½ story, Greek Revival style structure characterized by gable front orientation to the street, sidehall entry, and classical ornamentation. The main facade entrance has a 6 panelled door flanked by full-length sidelights. Flanking the sidelights are pilasters which rise to meet a full entablature surmounted by a closed pediment. On the southeast elevation is a second entrance which has a 4 panelled door flanked by full length sidelights. All of the windows have six over six sash and are capped with pedimented lintels. Wide pilasters rise up to meet gable end returns and the eave treatment consists of a boxed cornice with a narrow frieze. The medium pitched roof is topped by a narrow chimney and the structure rests on a granite slab foundation.

The 1½ story, gable roofed ell has clapboard siding, a 4 panelled door surmounted by a pediment motif, a tall, narrow chimney, and rests on a granite slab foundation. Projecting from the south elevation of the ell is a 1 story, gable roofed shed with vertical board siding and a vertical board door. It has six over six windows with pedimented lintels and rests on a brick foundation.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT: An attached 2½ story, gable roofed barn is located to the southwest of the house. It has wood shingle siding, a vertical board door, and rests on a fieldstone foundation. It has a 1 story shed roofed shed projecting from its southwest elevation and a 1 story shed roofed shed extending to the North. A separate 1½ story con:
