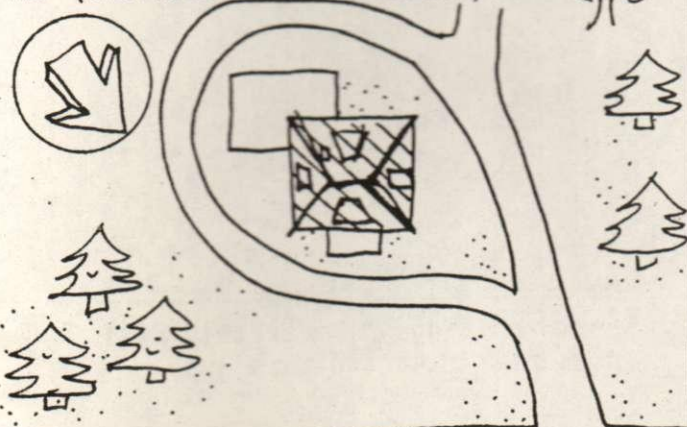

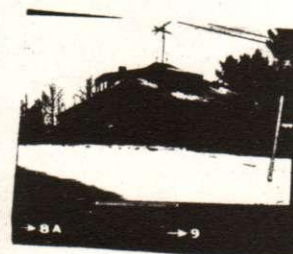

ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Marshall House is a 1½-story Bungalow style structure. The multi-paneled center entry door has eight lights and dentils. It is sheltered by a shed-roofed porch which is supported by square, tapering columns that rest on fieldstone piers. Windows have eight-over-one, eight-over-two, and six-over-one sash. The medium-pitched roof is topped by four shed-roofed dormers, and the cornice treatment consists of projecting eaves with exposed rafters. The entire structure rests on a rusticated cement foundation.

A screened 1-story porch on the rear has a hipped-roof with exposed rafters.

A 1-story shed-roofed wing to the northwest has the same siding, windows, eave treatment and foundation as the main block.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT: 1-story, gable-roofed, garage rests on a fieldstone foundation. Swimming pool, and 2 sheds.

BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION: .8 acres bounded to the N-Powwow River Road, Fuller, S-Bakie, E-Powwow River Road, W-Bakie, Fuller.

The Marshall House is a well developed example of the Bungalow Style said to be the last truly original American style. The rustic shingle siding and rusticated foundation as well as the sweeping rooflines are all hallmarks of this popular style.
