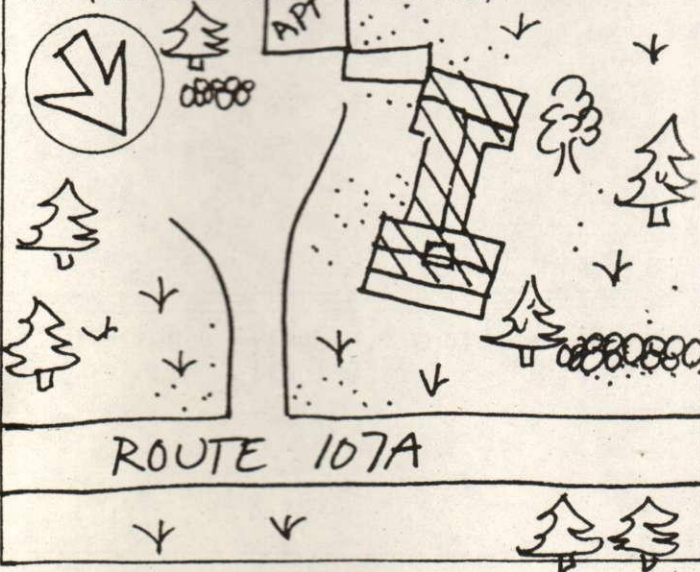

#### ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Fuller house is a  $2\frac{1}{2}$  story, 5 X 2 bay, vernacular structure built in the early twentieth century. The center entry has a multipanelled door with one large light sheltered by a 1 story, shed roofed veranda supported by turned, bracketed posts and exhibiting cement lattice work in its foundation. All of the windows have two over two sash and are framed by shutters. The low-pitched roof is topped by a narrow, corbel capped chimney and the eaves treatment consists of a boxed cornice with a narrow frieze and a sloped soffit underlying the lateral eaves. A fieldstone foundation supports the structure. The 1 story, gable roofed ell has clapboard siding, recent windows, a narrow corbel capped chimney, and a cement foundation.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT: To the south of the house is a separate  $1\frac{1}{2}$  story, gable roofed apartment. Also to the south is a  $1\frac{1}{2}$  story gambrel roofed barn.

BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION: 4 Acres. Bounded on the N. by Daniels, S. by Bakie, E. by Powwow River Road, and Marshall, W. by Battles.
