

ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Daniels House is a $2\frac{1}{2}$ story victorian era structure featuring gable front orientation to the street. The 4 panelled sidehall entry door contains one light and is topped by a partial entablature. Windows have two over two sash, except for one in the gable which has six over six sash. The medium pitched roof is topped by one corbel capped chimney and the eaves treatment consists of a boxed cornice with a sloped soffit. There is a small 1 story shed roofed entry porch on the rear elevation.

A $1\frac{1}{2}$ story wing has a saltbox roof, close eaves, two over two windows, clapboard siding and a stone foundation. It has a gable roofed wall dormer on the front facade, and a boarded up dormer on the rear that now has a chimney going through it.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT: A large gable roofed barn has clapboard siding, windows with two over two sash, a fixed twelve light window in the gable, and horizontally sliding vertical board doors. It rests on a fieldstone foundation. There is a long, gable roofed shed behind the house.

BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION: 3 Acres. Bounded to the N. by Cossar, S. by Fuller, E. by Powwow River Road, W. by Route 125.
