## ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Robie House is a 2-story, 3-bay Italàinate style structure. The 2-pahelled center entry door contains two vertical lights and is surmounted by a door hood supported by scroll d brackets with deep pendants. Windows are two-over-one with slightly projecting caps. The medium-pitched roof is topped by a narrow corbel-capped chimney, and the treatment at the eaves consists of a boxed, molded cornice with gable end returns.

A 1-story gable-roofed wing has an exterior chimney, a picture window, and a cement foundation. It has projecting raking eaves, and a boxed cornice on the lateral eaves. A 1-story, gable-roofed ell has a medium-pitched roof topped by one chimney, two-

over-one windows, and clapboard siding.

An attached 1-story shed has a 4-panelled door, wood shingle-siding, and a cement foundation.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT: 1-story hip-roofed garage has diagonal-board doors.

BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION: .9 acres bounded to the N-Buswell, S-Scotland Road, E-Hall, Buswell, W-Bowers.
