

ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Carr house is a modest 1½-story, early nineteenth century cottage. The center entry has a recent 4-panelled door with two lights. All of the windows have two-over-two sash framed by shutters. The medium-pitched roof is topped by a narrow chimney. The house rests on a stone foundation.

On the south elevation is a 1-story, enclosed porch. A 1-story, gable-roofed ell projects to the south. It has an attached 1-story shed on its south elevation.
