

ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION: The Gursky House is a 2½ story vernacular structure. The 3-panelled entry door contains four lights and has architrave trim. It is located within a 1-story, shedroofed wing. Windows have two-over-two sash and architrave trim. The medium-pitched roof is topped by a tall, corbel-capped chimney, and the treatment at the eaves consists of a boxed cornice with gable end returns. A 2-story gable-roofed ell rests on a brick foundation. It has windows with two-over-two sash, asbestos siding, a low-pitched roof topped by one chimney, and a boxed cornice with gable end returns. An attached 1½-story gable-roofed barn has been converted to apartments. It has windows with six-over-six sash, clapboard siding, haylofts doors, and a boxed cornice with a wide frieze and gable end returns. It has a multi-light bay window in the gable end. A 2-story addition to the east of the barn has clapboard siding, new one-over-one windows, a cement foundation, one chimney, and a boxed cornice with a wide frieze.
